Next Phase

We plan to use November and December to focus on working through technical document review submittals and transitioning to the next phase of work.

We continue to hear residents repeat the FALSE RUMOR that there is a plan to force residents out. This is not the case and is likely a great source of stress for your neighbors and any of you who believe it. Please help to disabuse your neighbors of this information. Several of your neighbors have shared that they are mentally stressed and fearful. It is our wish that the Resident Leadership Committee and your neighbors can all use the next couple of months to slow down and enjoy the lesser time commitment and the holidays without fear based on false information. We have worked very, very hard for all of you to be able to stay in Ponderosa.

Also, we thought you might find this one-hour radio show on KGNU of interest. It is part of a larger podcast series on manufactured housing in Boulder County, and this segment touches on Ponderosa and features the voices of RLC member Victor Lemus, Susan Lythgoe with Habitat for Humanity, and Crystal Launder with the City: https://www.kgnu.org/apublicaffair/10/31/2019

Heads-Up!

Kumar & Associates is tentatively scheduled to perform borings on November 18-19, 2019 to get soil samples you may have noticed that they have staked the preliminary locations of the borings with a wooden lathe with white flagging earlier this week. On the right is their preliminary plan of the 9 boring locations.

They will be on site most of the day (8am to 5pm) on November 18th and 19th. They anticipate being at each boring location for about 1 to 1½ hours, and will be drilling 4-inch diameter holes to a depth of about 20 to 30 feet. The equipment used is typically a truck-mounted drill rig that has a mast of about 30 feet and a support truck. They are also considering using a buggy-mounted rig since the equipment may be available. See pictures below.

Next Phase

With the Ponderosa annexation process completed and the property officially approved to annex into the City of Boulder, we are moving to the next phase of our work. All of us – residents, Trestle, the City – have been working hard for over two years to achieve this outcome. Two words summarize what to expect in the coming year: Habitat and Construction. Ponderosa households can begin to meet with Habitat in late January, after the first community meeting (see below). We are aiming to break ground on infrastructure construction in June. Habitat is hoping to begin construction on the first West Side homes next fall.

How We Will Work Together in 2020

We expect that many households will be busy meeting with Habitat in the winter and spring, then construction will begin. These activities mean that we will be working with your community in 2020 in the following ways:

- Four community meetings with updates (quarterly);
- Newsletters after each community meeting;
- Row-by-row meetings as construction occurs in different streets in Ponderosa;
- Door notices, door knocking; and text updates;
- Household by household meetings, as needed;
- Greg will help the community and the construction workers to most smoothly work together.

With the work that is happening now shifting to block-by-block and family-by-family, Resident Leadership Committee meetings won't be necessary in 2020. Thank you to the Resident Leadership Committee for the many hours you dedicated to serving your community. These and other neighbors will continue to lead in your community.

And as always, please call or email me, Crystal, if you have questions, concerns or ideas. I really want to be available to support Ponderosa through construction. Don't let a worry keep you up at night! Construction will be loud at times, you will need to park away from your home at times, there will be dust and dirt.
