RLC-BAHRI Ponderosa Community Survey

The Boulder Affordable Housing Research Initiative (BAHRI) along with members of the RLC have developed a survey to hear your thoughts about the RLC, Ponderosa's transition to city ownership, annexation and infrastructure replacement, the Ponderosa community in general and your home specifically. Please keep an eye out for the survey in the mail in early April, along with a self-addressed stamped envelope for return. Participants will be compensated \$5 for their time. Your participation in the survey is voluntary and your answers will remain anonymous. The BAHRI research team is committed to learning more about affordable housing communities in Boulder County. 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UPDATE FROM GREG

Hello Ponderosa Residents!

Do you miss the icy roads? I didn't think so!

During the March 3rd Ponderosa Design Workshop #4, someone questioned our commitment to affordability. You can question a lot of things, but it's very difficult to question our commitment to affordability. I started managing Ponderosa almost 5 years ago. In that time, we only did a single \$30 rent raise (+6%). During that 5 years, the average rental price per ft^2 in Boulder went up ~35-50%! At the same time we worked hard to make Ponderosa a better place to live. Other mobile home parks in Boulder raise rent \$30-50 per year. We include water, sewer, and trash in the Ponderosa rent, and other mobile home parks charge \$50-75 extra per month for those services. Our water, sewer, trash, etc bills are going up and we are NOT passing that cost on to residents. Boulder city has committed to keeping space rent at \$530 for the next ~2 years. We fought hard and did what was necessary to keep prices low. It's easy to argue that from 2013 to 2020, this commitment to affordability will save ~\$10,000 for each Ponderosa household. We know you are getting a VERY good deal. And we know you know you are getting a very good deal. Why? Because almost no one leaves the community and 100's of people have tried to get in but can't. I quit maintaining a wait list 2 years ago because it was too long and I wasn't helping anyone move in.

A Ponderosa survey will be mailed to you in the coming weeks. Yes, it's long, but please fill out what you can and mail back. If you don't fill out and mail back, we will come by your home and do the survey face to face with CU students. Isn't it interesting how many people around Boulder care what you think?

Community Design Workshop 4 Summary: Concept Plan Review

After the workshop that took place at Wild Sage on January 27th, the Trestle team took all the ideas and feedback that emerged from the site planning exercise completed by the residents and developed a first draft concept site plan of Ponderosa. The site plan, along with phasing diagrams, were presented to residents at workshop #4. Residents were able to ask questions about the plans and provide their feedback and comments. The feedback received was incorporated and an updated Concept Plan was shared with the RLC on March 5th. The concept plan and phasing will be presented to the residents will be submitted to City Council for concept review on April 16th.
